1910

1911



Seeking fresh and untapped markets, Charles moved his business, now NJ Grinding Company, to Newark, NJ and upgraded to a horse and wagon housed at 130 Bank Street.

1914

Soon after, he graduated from horse to horseless with the purchase of a 1914 Republic solid tire truck. His territory began to expand and Elizabeth was now on the horizon.
